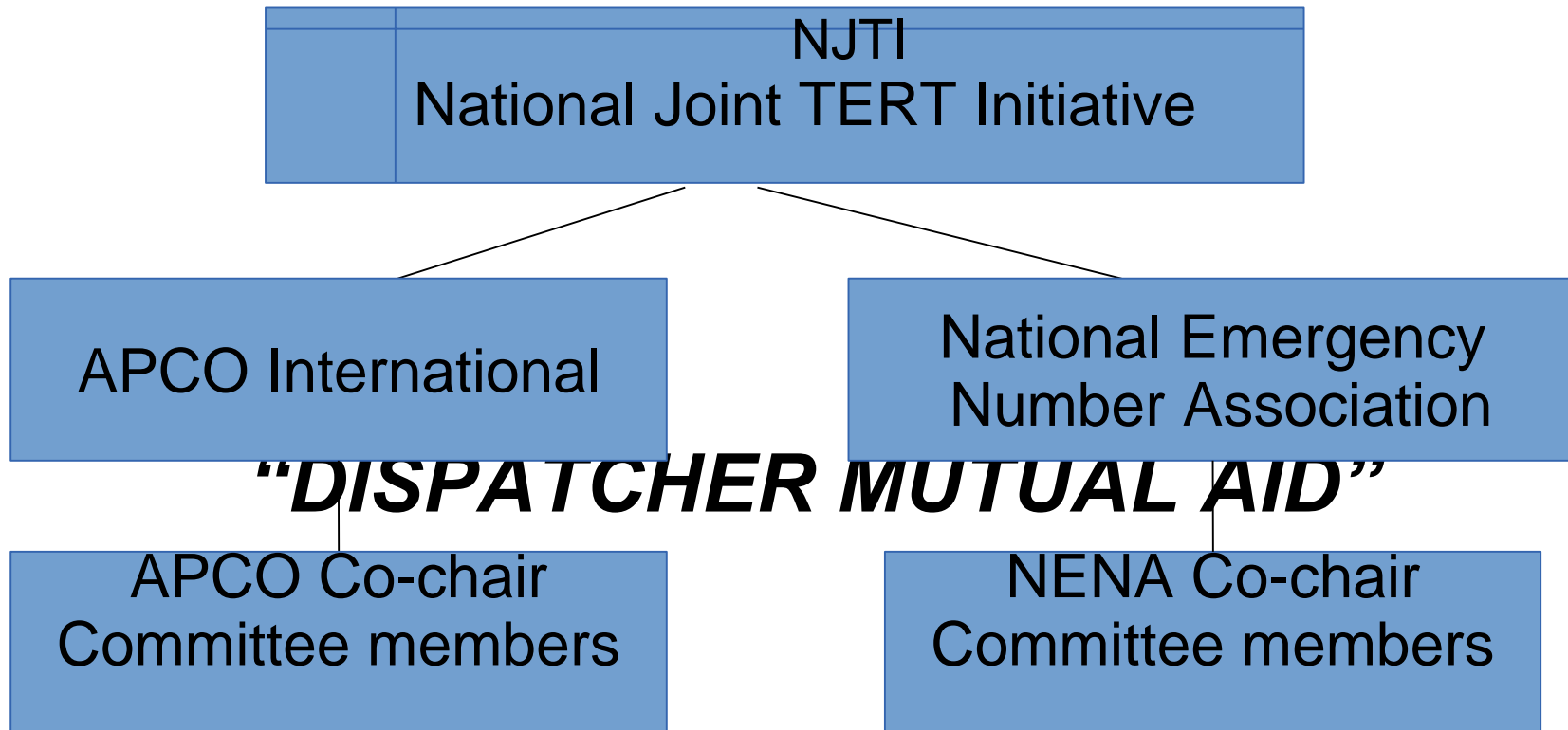

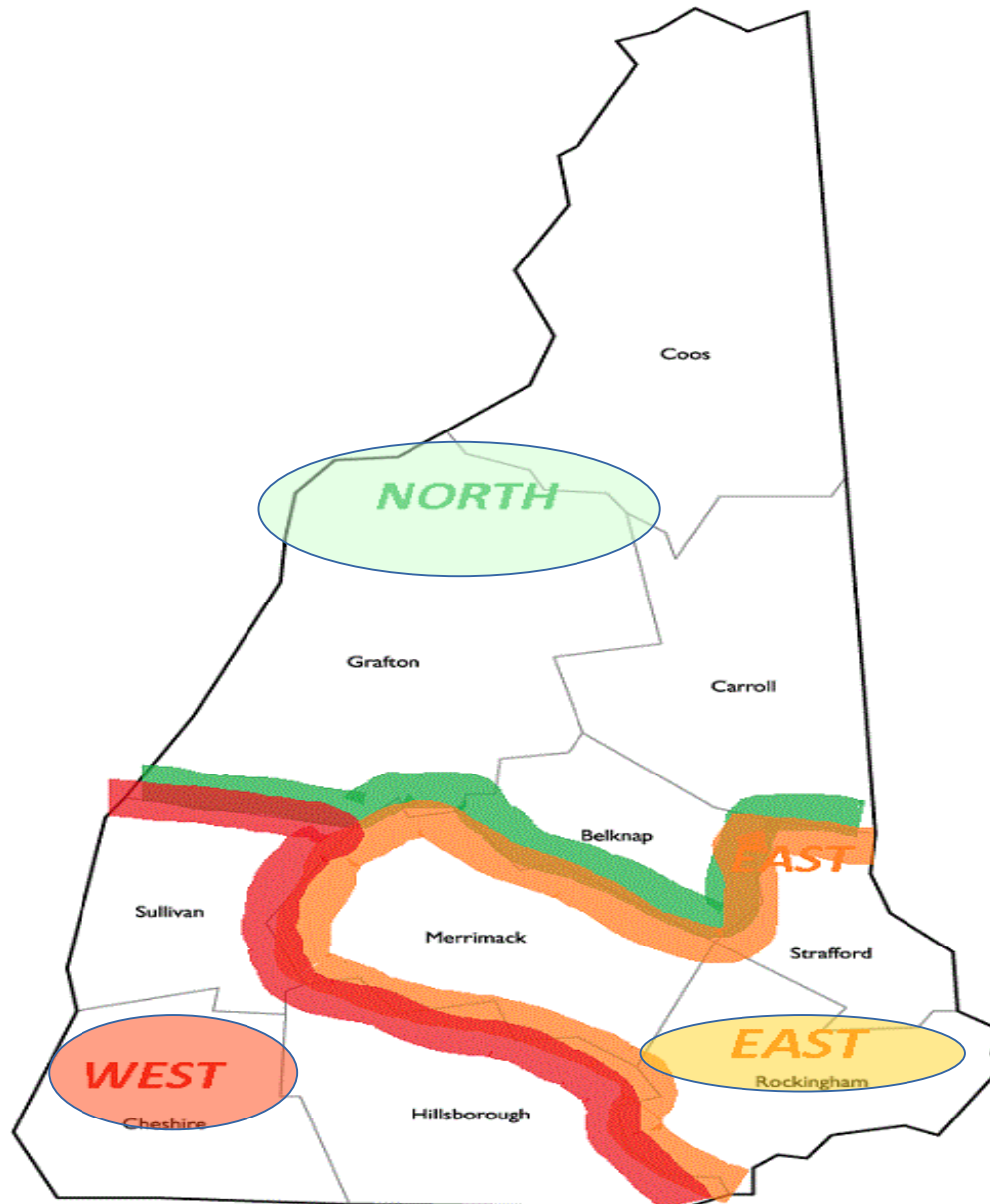

NHTERT member qualifications

WILL BE UPDATING....

- * Must work as a Telecommunicator with an agency within the State of New Hampshire
- * SPOTS/NCIC Certification Preferred
- * Must have an approved Basic Telecommunicator Certification, such as APCO or Powerphone.
- * Must have NIMS 700 Certification
- * Must have ICS 200 training
- * Must attend WMD Training and Blood Borne Pathogens training within one year of appointment to the Team
- * Attendance at WMD Training in Alabama within one year of appointment to the Team is recommended.
- * Must attend 4 of the TERT Monthly Meetings/Trainings per year.
- * Must have a letter from their agency stating their intent to allow them to join.
- * Must have the ability to work well in a Team Environment
- * Must have a personal commitment to being a Team Member

NHTERT roles/responsibilities

- * **Will be recommended by the Training and Standards Committee.**
- * Will answer directly to their Team Leader
- * Will attend initial training on WMD and Bloodborne Pathogens within one year of appointment to the Team
- * Will attend a minimum of 4 Monthly Trainings per year
- * Will attend any additional training as necessary
- * Will respond to all incidents when on call or as backup
- * When activated, will respond to location assigned by the Team Leader
- * Will remain in good standing with their agency
- * Responsible to notify their agency of response to incident
- * Responsible to notify Team Leader of their absences on their assigned month
- * If first on scene, will determine need for further resources, and notify Team Leader of details at the scene

When you call for NHTERT...

WHAT WE NEED TO KNOW TO PUT TOGETHER A TEAM FOR YOU

- ◇ A brief description of your incident or problem
- ◇ How long do you anticipate that assistance will be needed?
- ◇ How many personnel are you requesting?
- ◇ Do you need fire/EMS dispatchers, police dispatchers, and/or call-takers?
- ◇ What shifts need to be covered?
- ◇ What duties would you like performed?
- ◇ Will we need to provide any kind of equipment?
- ◇ Where will our personnel report and to whom?
- ◇ Are there any obstacles in getting to the scene (or the location of need)?
- ◇ Name and contact number for the person making the request for assistance
